## **Sub:-Extension of approval of affiliation of Gujarat National Law University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat**

Sir,

The Legal Education Committee at its meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup> September 2009 considered the inspection of above mentioned University and Committee made the following recommendations:-

“Legal Education Committee considered the inspection report of Gujarat National Law University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat submitted by the inspection team of the Bar Council of India. After consideration Committee is of the view that extension of approval of affiliation may be granted to the above mentioned institute for imparting B.A. LL.B. five year law course only for one year i.e. for the academic year 2009-2010 with existing strength of students with a direction to comply with the following:-

1. That the University authorities should construct building immediately and progress about the construction of building be sent to the Bar Council of India.
2. To maintain the register in the library and make a provision of proper distribution of books to the law students.
3. To purchase more law books worth Rs. 1,00,000/- in the library.
4. To provide good hostel facilities to the students.
5. To appoint teaching faculty on regular basis.


Compliance of the above conditions should be reported to the Bar Council of India within a period of three months by way of an affidavit.

Further, Committee makes it clear that as per the new rules of the Bar Council of India relating to Legal Education, maximum intake in one section should be 60 students from the academic year 2009-2010 and therefore college authorities are directed to admit only 60 students in one section from the coming session i.e. 2009-2010. In case number of students exceed the limit now prescribed as per existing strength of number of sections such additional students already admitted may be permitted to continue in the additional section keeping in view the staff and infrastructure available to the college concerned.”

The above recommendations were considered by the Bar Council of India at its meeting held on 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2009 and accepted the same.

University authorities are also required to apply to the Bar Council of India for further extension of approval of affiliation six months in advance before expiry of the period of approval of affiliation granted by the Bar Council of India.
